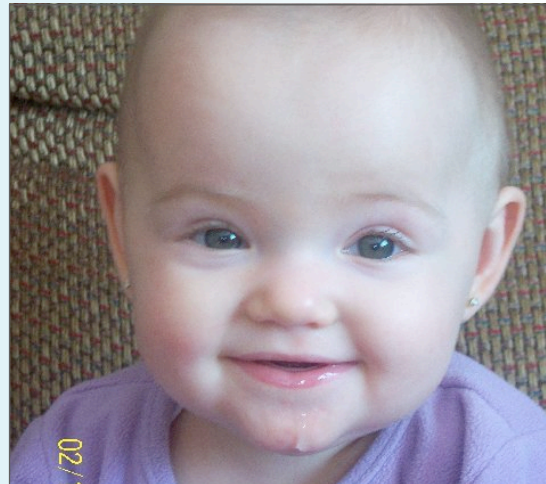

HUMAN MILK contains unique nutrients, antibodies and growth factors which babies receive with each nursing. Mothers have shared this gift with others throughout history and across the world.

The Mothers' Milk Bank of New England is privileged to be part of this proud and vital tradition.



WHAT IS A MOTHERS' MILK BANK?

A mothers' milk bank collects, processes, tests and distributes donated human milk, primarily for premature and sick infants.

IS MILK BANKING SAFE?

Multiple redundant steps are taken to ensure that banked milk is safe to be given to vulnerable babies. Donor screening includes a detailed medical history and blood tests to detect transmittable diseases including HIV and hepatitis. Donor milk is heat-treated and it is only dispensed after a culture shows no bacterial growth. Milk is then frozen and shipped overnight.

In more than 40 years of modern milk banking, there has never been a documented case of an infant being harmed by donor milk.

MMBNE operates under established guidelines of the Human Milk Banking Association of North America.

HOW MUCH DOES BANKED MILK COST AND WHO PAYS FOR IT?

Donors are not paid for their milk. However, the milk bank does pay for donor blood tests as well as processing and shipping costs - \$4.50 per ounce. In some circumstances, health insurance companies cover banked milk costs. Parents and hospitals cover some of the costs. Grants and private donations allow MMBNE to send milk to families regardless of their ability to pay.

WHAT ABOUT PREEMIE FORMULA?

The unique components of human milk cannot be reproduced in formula.
