TARGET AUDIENCE

This course has been designed for pediatricians, family physicians, nurses, nurse practitioners, physician assistants, and allied health professionals caring for children. The 9th Annual Yale Pediatric Update features prominent faculty presenting topics that highlight current issues in pediatrics. Each course combines lectures, interactive seminars, and question-and-answer sessions to allow you the opportunity to interact directly with faculty in solving the problems you encounter every day in practice.

RELICENSURE

Beginning October 1, 2007, a physician applying for license renewal must have completed at least 50 contact hours of continuing education during the previous 24 months. It must (1) be in the physician's practice area; (2) reflect the physician's professional needs in order to meet the public's health care needs; and (3) include at least one contact hour of training or education in infectious diseases (e.g. AIDS, HIV), risk management, sexual assault, and domestic violence.
